



K12 National Clubs

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How do I sign up for a national club?

Students can sign up for a national club by going to <https://www.k12.com/k12-student-clubs.html>, reading the club descriptions, and choosing the club(s) that interest them. Once students click on a club, they will be directed to a survey to input information. Once they hit submit on the form, it can take up

to three weeks for their names to be added to the club roster and to receive information about the next club meeting.

Why does it take two to three weeks to be added to a club?

Unfortunately, signing up for clubs is not automated. Each student is individually added to a chosen club(s) by a dedicated team member. Many of our students are excited about participating in national clubs; as such, it can take up to two or three weeks to be added to your club(s). Once added, a student will receive a school email from the club leader with an invitation to the next club meeting.

Why does the National Clubs Online Sign-Up form require my student ID?

The National Club Online Sign-Up form requires a student ID, so we can be sure we correctly identify which student to add to the requested club.

How do I find my student ID in my Online School account?

How many clubs can I participate in at one time?

To ensure that students are prioritizing their academics and required Class Connect sessions, they can participate in up to four clubs at one time.

What if I want to join a club that is not offered for my grade level?

Clubs are created with specific grade levels in mind, with club content geared to that developmental level. In addition, grade-level clubs provide opportunities for students to connect with other students in the same grade. Therefore, we encourage students to enroll in clubs for their specific grade.

I want to attend a different club. How do I withdraw from one club to sign up for another?

A student can withdraw from a club in two ways:

- a. You can email your club leader and request to be removed from the club roster. To expedite your withdrawal request, please include the following information:
 - Student name
 - Student ID
 - School
 - Grade
- b. You can email clubs@k12.com to request removal from a club. Please be sure to include the same information listed above in your withdrawal request.

Once removed, how can I be added to another club?

Students can sign up for another club by returning to the [National Clubs website](#). Please review all options before making your choice.

How often do clubs meet?

Most national clubs meet once or twice per month, beginning in September and spanning through May. The frequency of club meetings is as follows:

September–1 Club Meeting

October–2 Club Meetings

November–2 Club Meetings

December–1 Club Meeting

January–1 Club Meeting

February–2 Club Meeting

March–1 Club Meeting

April–1 Club Meeting

May–1 Club Meeting

How long do club meetings last?

Club meetings generally last for one hour. However, because clubs are not mandatory, students are encouraged to attend for a time that fits their schedules.

What days of the week do clubs meet?

All K12 national clubs are led by teachers who host clubs in addition to their teaching schedules. Often this means that club meeting times will vary, but most clubs meet for one hour between 9 AM–7 PM, Monday–Friday. Clubs do not meet on the weekends or on K12 holidays. To accommodate as many student schedules as possible, the day of the week can change from month to month and from meeting to meeting.

How will I be notified that a club meeting is coming up?

Students will receive a school email from a club leader at least one week in advance of the upcoming club meeting. At that time, the club meeting link will also be added to students' Class Connect schedules on the daily plan.

Is participation in national clubs or national club meetings mandatory?

No. Attendance at any national club meeting is completely voluntary. School courses should always take priority over club meetings. National club teachers make every effort to move meeting times around to

accommodate the scheduling needs of all students. As a reminder, on those rare days when courses or clubs do overlap, always prioritize courses because club meetings will be recorded and made available within 24 hours.

Can students receive attendance credit for attending a national club?

No. National clubs are optional for students, and attendance will not be given for time spent at a national club meeting.

How do I find the link to my club?

The links to all club meetings will be placed on students' Online School daily plans. On the day of a club, students will locate the link to enter the club at the scheduled time in their Class Connect list.

How can I get caught up if I miss a live club meeting?

Club meetings are recorded and the links for those recordings will be available to students in two ways:

- a. Within 24 hours after the club meeting, the recording will be posted. To access the recording, a student can click the Class Connect link to the club meeting they missed. It will automatically take the student to the recording.
- b. If the recording is not already posted, please email your club leader to request a recording link.

What is the National Club Exit Satisfaction Survey and why should I complete it each meeting?

The National Club Exit Satisfaction Survey is a brief survey pushed out at the end of every club meeting. Club leaders send this survey out to gather student feedback about the club meeting, including feedback on what you liked and what we could do better. Please take the time to fill these out every meeting, so we can continue to use your ideas to make national clubs engaging and fun for all who attend.

What rules are students asked to follow to participate in national clubs?

- Show respect for all students and teachers.
- Use the tools only as directed.
- Use school-appropriate language.
- Sign in using your K12-approved name.
- Do not post personal information or external links.

Failure to honor these guidelines will result in the infraction being communicated to your school leaders and Learning Coach, along with possible removal from clubs.
